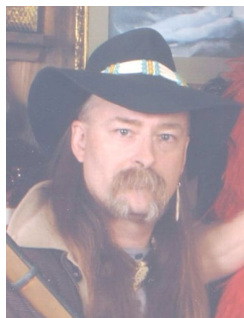
April 2010 President's Note

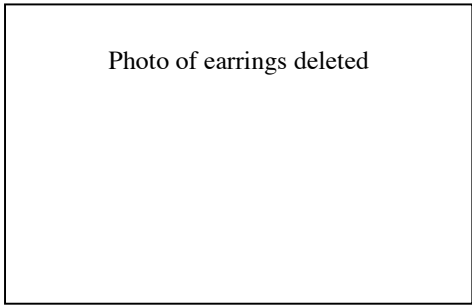
Calvert Artists' Guild May Multi-Media Awards Show Sat-Sun, May 22-23, 2010

Calling all artists to mark your calendars for Saturday and Sunday, **May 22 and 23, 2010** for the annual **May "CAG Multi-Media Awards Show"** at Annmarie Garden. Hours are **10am-4pm each day**. We will again feature ribbons and monetary awards. Monetary awards to be presented at the Reception on Saturday May 22nd. The judge for awards is Alice Travis Kale from Alexandria, VA. (see info on Page 3)

Rules: Artwork must be original and have been completed within last two years. Artwork must not have won an award in a previous CAG Show. Artists in all mediums are encouraged to join in this special show. We would like to see drawing, ceramics, photography, textiles, jewelry & metalwork, painting, printmaking, sculpture, and mixed media. Jurying will take place on Friday afternoon 1-4, with critique and ribbons Friday 4-5pm. A reception will be held on Saturday, May 22nd from 2pm to 4pm to meet the artists and present the CAG scholarship award and monetary awards. Exhibiting artists are asked to sign up to sit the gallery for a two-hour shift on Saturday or Sunday. **Registrations are to be postmarked by May 8th, no registrations will be accepted after May 10th.**

Artwork should be dropped off at Annmarie Garden Gallery on Friday, May 21, 2010, from 10:30am to 12 noon. Do not bring in artwork before 10:30 a.m. Volunteers are needed to help set-up the show between 9:00-10:30. The entry fee for the May 2010 Awards show is \$25.00 for members and \$35.00 for non-members. The entry fee covers administrative fees, awards, advertising and program costs, and any merchant account fees associated with credit card sales. IMPORTANT CHANGE: Annmarie Garden has increased the sales commission this year to 25%, which is a 10% increase over previous years. In the recent past, the Guild has actually assumed the commission cost and has not charged the artists. However, with this increase and the potential risk to the Guild of large commission payments if sales are high, the Guild will no longer be able to subsidize this sales commission cost. Therefore, with this May 2010 show, artists will be responsible for the 25% commission due Annmarie Garden, which will be deducted from sales proceeds payments. We have been extremely fortunate that the Guild elected to cover the cost of commissions to this point. We are informing the artists in advance so that artists can make the decision whether to raise prices for the May show to cover the cost of the commission. Thanks in advance for your cooperation and understanding. 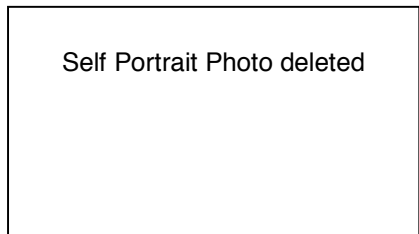

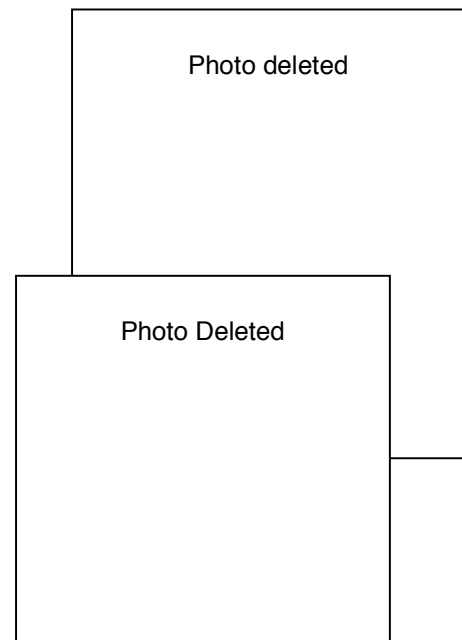

MEET THE ARTIST!

Featuring New member: Don Oswald

I've been both painting and drawing on and off for the last 15 years but I've had no formal education in the arts. The closest to a class I've been is when I sat down and worked my way through all of the exercises in a Betty Edward's book. I went to school as an electrical engineer, and ended up in computers and communications systems.

I've been making a colorful mess for a while. A change in work priorities encouraged me to think about new steps. For the last 5 years or so, I've always had a sketchpad going. Let's face it, everyone of a certain age, who works in oils got introduced to it as "happy little trees." I still have a few brushes and a couple tubes of paint from that era but those generic landscapes got a little repetitive, and I wandered away for a bit.

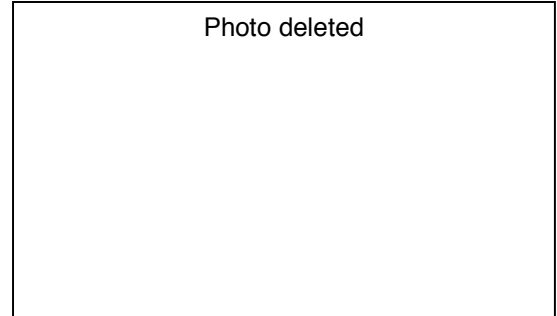
Then came a five-year period at work where I was on the road one week out of the month. I started carrying a sketchpad, and then eventually charcoal. I developed more of an eye for shading and how to make a picture work without sharp details. I also have two sketch pads full of portraits of people in airline seats. When I returned to the oils, those experiences really helped. I like the shading and variations in tone that I can achieve with thicker oils. It helps that they have a relatively long working time and that they will cover each other if I need to go back for a redo. I enjoy carving the colors, and adding textures to go with the colors.

I am encouraged and inspired by my wife (but those drawings are Not For Sale). I was also inspired by the first person that bought something. I wrote a random number on a price tag and sold a piece. Seriously...nothing like seeing that some else values your art to get you started.

I have been a member of the Calvert Artists' Guild for several months. I met a few good people at the first show that I did and that prompted my decision to join.

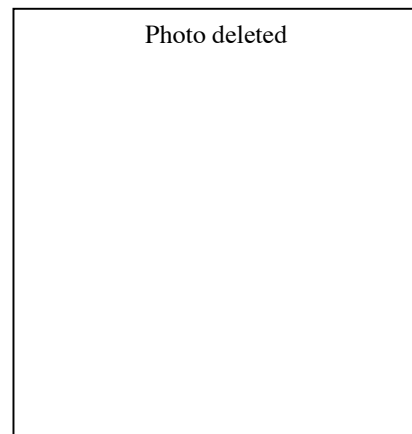
As far as art goes I'm still at the start. I am working to doing something every other day that helps my art, either actually working on a piece, sketching, or even writing about it.
