Calvert Artists' Guild March Spring Show"

Calling all artists to mark your calendars for Saturday and Sunday, **March 12 and 13**, **2005** for the annual Southern Maryland show at Annmarie Garden. Artists in all mediums are encouraged to join in this special show. We would like to see fiber work, jewelry, sculpture, glass, batik, weaving, ceramics, as well as paintings. An artist's reception will be held on Saturday, March 12th from 2pm to 4pm. The entry fee for CAG members is \$25.00 and \$35.00 fee for non-members. Exhibiting artists are asked to sign up to sit the gallery for a two-hour shift on Saturday or Sunday. Registrations are due by **March 7th**, no registrations will be accepted after this date. Artwork can be dropped off at Annmarie Garden on Friday March 11th, 2005, from 10am to 1pm.

As a requirement at Annmarie Garden we are now required to submit a photo, postcard, or notecard of the type of artwork to be shown along with the registration form. (Form follows in newsletter) Annmarie Garden will keep a file of all artists and their artwork samples for future reference. This means that you only have to submit the initial photo and for future shows, you state "photo on file" on your registration form. You do not have to resubmit a new photo for every show. If you submitted your sample in 2004, you do not need to resubmit for 2005. The only exception would be if you change media—(i.e. from oil paintings to jewelry, ceramics to paintings, etc.). The Guild will submit all registrations and representative samples of artwork to Annmarie Garden. News from Arlaine Flynn, ACCC

The Arts Council of Calvert County wanted to take this opportunity to thank the Artist's Guild for it's continued support of the council and it's goals in expanding the role of the arts in Calvert County.

After meeting with the Guild President, Gerry Wood, I thought this would be a good opportunity to tell you about some of the things the Arts Council is currently working on. Our inaugural live art auction and benefit dance, Spring time in Paris is our main focus for the year. However we have expanded many of our other programs and added several new ones.

Our **Sundays of Note** concert series has been transformed into a jazz series to be held at Mom's in the Kitchen Café in Prince Frederick. Our free **Courtyard Concerts** at Prince Frederick Courthouse will continue but we have added two concerts to the gazebo at Solomons. We have partnered with the Calvert Marine Museum to host a **Valentine Tea Dance** for our more mature members, and we are using our outreach efforts to bring programs to preschoolers and teens.

The council is also developing a **CalvART society** and a **CalvART card**. The society will be comprised of individuals who make a significant financial contribution to the Arts. The **CalvART card** is a membership discount card for art patrons. The concept involves artists and arts groups around the county signing up to become a part of the card. Each vendor would offer discounts either on ticket prices or a percentage off the sales price of their work, reserved seating at performances or something of that nature. There is no fee associated with the card for vendors but the hope is it will be an effective marketing and promotion tool for the arts. We have already spoken to the Department of Economic Development regarding the tourism potential for this card and they are in support of it. As the card becomes established we hope to make it available via tourism information booths.

Again thank you for your support I look forward to continuing the strong relationship our two organizations have enjoyed over the years.

Report from Tammy Vitale, ACCC Liaison

Here are the highlights:

Sonia Wagner, Chair Arts Initiative Subcommittee, Citizens Advisory Committee, reported exploring with Centra Office Arts Dept (schools) an initiative to assist in identifying key factors which could contribute better awareness and attendance for high school arts programs. She mentioned mostly performing arts, and I encouraged also the visual arts. The one program I went to at Patuxent High was excellent but poorly attended. Sonia wants a centrally located comprehensive calendar of events, newspaper articles, and tickets series (like the Kennedy center). She would like to work with the Arts Council on this project. The Arts Council would like to assist as long as the material received is already in order and doesn't have to be worked on by Arts Council staff. Arlaine (ex.dr.) and Laurie (president) noted that part of the strategic plan for the council includes better outreach to and coordination with public school arts programs. ACCC is looking for volunteers for January events and February; Sunday of Note, Feb 20; and Alexander's Harmonizers, Feb 26. Also looking for volunteers for summer arts camp (says "same as last year" - I don't know what that

means and there was no discussion). ACCC is looking at sponsoring a room at the new library. There will be 3 meeting rooms and a coffee room where rotating art displays may be possible.

January 25, 4:30 - 6:30, next to Mom's in the Kitchen in the old telecommuting office in the shopping center where the

Country Market space is, ACCC will hold an artists reception for all artists who donated to their Spring in Paris fundraiser. Participating artists will be photographed for the auction book at that time. January 26, 4:30 - 6:30, same space as above, new members of ACCC will receive info on the organization as well as get a chance to review the art going up for auction and learn about volunteer opportunities.

The discussion of gallery space proposal was held in executive session. Other news: I reported to them that I received a call today from Diane Grisner of St Mary's Economic Development. She works for Caroline who will be heading up workshops and focus groups on the Southern Maryland Heritage Trail. This is a mapping of galleries AND individual artist studios in Southern Maryland. Funding is coming through TriCounty Council and everything is very formative - no dates for meetings yet and I couldn't get any further information on funding. Laurie was interested in funding for Calvert. I've wanted something like this in Calvert for at least 4 years but haven't managed funding. I plan to look into it all a bit more.
