# Featured Artist Matthew Spaulding



Matthew graduated from St. Lawrence University with a bachelor's degree in neuroscience. As a student he received a Tanner Fellowship for an independent study, allowing him to develop a photographic essay of conservation efforts on the Chesapeake Bay. His passions for photography and the sciences have led him to conduct marine research off the coast of Maine, study endangered birds in rural North Dakota, assist with Diamondback Terrapin research on the Chesapeake Bay, and study in Australia's Great Barrier Reef and rainforests.

Matthew specializes in editorial, landscape, nature and travel photography and is a member of the National Press Photographers Association (NPPA) and Professional Photographers of America (PPA). He is a contributor to the National Geographic Image Collection and his photographs have been published with ESPN affiliate Inside Lacrosse, The American Red Cross and through various stock agencies.

Matt has been ardently shooting photos since age eleven when his father gave him his old film camera. As a child he loved exploring the natural world, and photography provided a way of capturing everything that he found interesting. Matt joined a photography club in middle-school, and built a small darkroom in their basement. "I've been fascinated with the medium ever since, and I think there is something exciting about the ability strong imagery has to evoke emotion in the viewer and artist alike". Matt's grandmother was also a great influence on him. She gave him hundreds of National Geographic magazines when he was young. "I could feel something in those photos that drew my attention, and I quickly found myself differentiating and identifying the elements of a powerful photo". When looking at Matthew's photographs you can also see the influence of Ansel Adams.

Most of Matthew's knowledge about photography is self-taught, although he says "It's really the experiences that teach me most, like fumbling with a tripod on a dark winter night or getting eye level with an aggressive snake and misjudging my distance". When asked what was the best thing you have done for your art career? Matt says "Letting my camera ride "shotgun" when driving so I don't miss as many unexpected shots. Some of my favorite images were taken with just seconds to spare, and I hate missing opportunities when I see them although the obsessive attention I give to photography when I'm constantly carrying a camera and traveling can sometimes have a negative effect on my overall experience, so it's also important for me to spend time simply enjoying nature and hiking".

Since graduating from St. Lawrence University, Matthew has worked as a whitewater rafting guide on the Yellowstone River in Montana, sailed to the West Indies to live for eight months aboard a 37 foot sailboat, and recently served with the American Red Cross as an AmeriCorps VISTA Volunteer Coordinator. As an avid outdoorsman he is also an advanced scuba diver and nationally registered Wilderness Emergency Medical Technician. Matt is now focusing on becoming a field instructor with the National Outdoor Leadership School (NOLS) and pursuing work as a science teacher.

Matthew's artistic future will be spent working on publishing his ongoing journalistic work. "The benefit of being young is also part of the dilemma in navigating the paths ahead, and I'm working to focus more of my photo-journalism projects for future publishing".

#### Calvert Artists' Guild May Multi-Media Awards Show Sat-Sun, May 19-20, 2012

Calling all artists to mark your calendars for Saturday and Sunday, May 19 and 20, 2012 for the annual May "CAG Multi-Media Awards Show" at Annmarie Garden. Hours are 10am-5pm Saturday & 10-4 Sunday. We will again feature ribbons and monetary awards. Monetary awards to be presented at the Reception on Saturday May 19th. The judge for awards is Joan Bell, of Annapolis, MD.

Rules: Artwork must be original and have been completed within last two years. Artwork must not have won an award in a previous CAG Show. Artists in all mediums are encouraged to join in this special show. We would like to see drawing, ceramics, photography, textiles, jewelry & metalwork, painting, printmaking, sculpture, and mixed media. Jurying will take place on Friday afternoon 1-4, with critique and ribbons Friday 4-5pm. A reception will be held on Saturday, May 19th from 2pm to 4pm to meet the artists and present the CAG HS Art award and monetary awards. Exhibiting artists are asked to sign up to sit the gallery for a two-hour shift on Saturday or Sunday. Registrations are to be postmarked by May 11th, no registrations will be accepted after May 12th. Artwork should be dropped off at Annmarie Garden Gallery on Friday, May 18, 2012, from 10:30am to 12 noon. Do not bring in artwork before 10:30 a.m. Volunteers are needed to help set-up the show between 9:00-10:30. The entry fee for the May 2012 Awards show is \$25.00 for members. The entry fee covers administrative fees, awards, advertising and program costs, and any merchant account fees associated with credit card sales. IMPORTANT: Annmarie Garden has set the sales commission to 25%, Artists will be responsible for the 25% commission due Annmarie Garden, which will be deducted from sales proceeds payments. We are informing the artists in advance so that artists can raise prices for the show to cover the commission. 
