

BIOSKETCH

Carolyn Huff started doing woodcarving in 1971 at St. Mary's College of Maryland. While earning her art degree there, she found her passion was in bas relief woodcarving. Carving into a flat piece of wood and telling stories in her carvings is what she best likes to do.

Her first woodcarving, titled "The Good Old Days," represents St. Mary's City with the Ark and the Dove ships sailing in the St. Mary's River in the center, tobacco leaves on the sides of the picture, a woman out plowing the field in the left scene and a craftsman woodcarving in the right scene. This carving was displayed at the Annapolis State House.

Over the past 40 years she has done mostly commission work and participated in crafts shows like the Unique Boutique during the '70's and 80's. She was commissioned to do a woodcarving of the mulberry tree by the Garden of Remembrance at St. Mary's College, to be inserted into the Mulberry Tree Society Plaque, listing those who make estate donations to the college.

She taught woodcarving classes through the Home Extension Service, Robby's Arts and Crafts shop and later out of her home. She was a charter participate when the Cecil Old Mill first opened to display local craftsman doing their work. She also sold her carvings at the Christmas Country Store, now known as the Cecil Country Store.

Carol Wade ia a professional artist who specializes in graphic design, acrylic painting and mixed media. She is an exhibiting member of the Artworks at 7th gallery in North Beach Maryland and the Calvert Artists' Guild. She also has 40 years of experience as a graphic designer, serving 30 years at the College of Southern Maryland. In addition, she taught Photoshop and Illustrator for several years at the college. She is now retired and enjoys having more time to invest into her paintings.

Carol has been painting since the age of thirteen. Her mother and grandmother, who was also an artist, encouraged her interest in art. "She set up a workspace for me and gave me drawing lessons when I was a little girl." In middle and high school, Carol enrolled in enrichment courses in art, including drawing lessons at the Corcorran School of Art in Washington, D.C. She received a B.A. in Graphic Design at the Md. Institute of Art in Baltimore, and has worked in the field ever since.

Carol prefers to use acrylic paint because it dries much faster than oil paint, which allows her to be more spontaneous and not have to wait to make changes. Sometimes she likes to include other materials into her paintings, such as old strips of sheet music or printed paper, cardboard, tissue paper, etc., a process known as mixed media. Generally, she starts with choosing from one of her own photographs and creates her own interpretation in a painting or mixed media piece.

"I am inspired by my environment. I love going on meditative walks, observing nature, and going to galleries to see other artist's work. I also draw a lot from my experience as a graphic designer. My background in graphic design has definitely made an impact on my paintings, particularly in terms of composition. I love experimenting with mixed media acrylic painting because it lends itself to being more abstract and expressive."

By-Law Change Proposal

At the December 8th meeting, a CAG by-law proposal will be voted on. The change to the by-laws concerns Article VII, Section E. (page 18) which states: "All officers shall hold office for no more than three consecutive terms." To be changed to state" All officers shall hold office with no term limit."

See your Directory/Roster 2012/13, page 20 under Article XV – Revisions which states that Voting for changes to the Constitution and By-laws shall be by the participating artist membership present at the Annual Business Meeting. A two-thirds majority of those present is required to approve a proposed change.

Demonstration Artist

Faith Gaillot



Before she became an artist, Faith Gaillot was planning to become a poet. During her senior year in high school, she decided to take a commercial art class. This began her career in art. Her art teacher, encouraged her to continue her art after graduation and with this encouragement she began working with acrylics. Faith worked with this very easy

medium (though not finding it very challenging) until she decided to attend college in her mid thirties. Her art career then took a totally different direction.

When she entered college her first art instructor, seeing her love for detail, encouraged her to become a pen and ink artist because it truly is the only medium that you can elaborate in detail. Another college instructor encouraged her to do the same. In his classes she also discovered watercolors, which she sometimes uses with her pen & ink artwork.

Discovering very few books on pen and ink, she decided to develop her own methods, which has helped her receive great reviews in Virginia newspapers for her subjects being "accurate to the smallest crack in the brick". She uses only one size pen for the entire drawing. By holding the pen at different angles, she can achieve the different size lines she needs. She uses very little cross hatching, and that mainly for shading.

With this challenging, but "feared" medium she has received various awards including Champion of the Adult Art Division, in two county fairs in 2010 and has demonstrated her techniques in Maryland and Virginia. She is affiliated with Studio A – Colonial Beach, VA, Colonial Beach Artists' Guild, Fredericksburg Center for the Creative Arts, Baltimore Watercolor Society, and the Calvert Artists' Guild.
