# **Drawing Faces**

An exherpt from Artist Daily "Drawing Faces" by Dan Gheno

#### Put Your Head in a Box


Use perspective to better gauge the tiltof the head by trying to visualize thehead encased in a box, as Albrecht Düreril-lustrated in his notebooks. It's easier to imagine a box tilting in space, with oppositesides slanting at near parallel angles. This helps you remember that if the front of the face is angling down, the back of the head follows the same slant. If you are imagining the head encased within a box, you'll also remember to tilt the top and bottom of the head as

well. It also helps to use perspectival tracking lines to align the features as they recede into space. Keep in mind that these imaginary perspective lines converge downward if you are drawing the face from below and converge upward if your eye level is above the model.

#### **Directions from route 4:**

From the south: turn left on Ball Rd at the Rock Church/park and ride. Go to dead end at Broomes Is Rd, turn left. Go to end Broomes Is Rd, turn rt on Penkert Lane. Go straight then keep to the right at first turn (paper boxes should be on your left) to 1st house, 2 story grey, on left after blacktop ends. From the north: turn right on Broomes Is Rd, go 7miles to end, follow south directions. I will put an arrow at the paper boxes.

#### **Jason Powell**

Jason grew up as a nerdy kid into science, philosophy and the Bible, who also loved skateboarding and going to hardcore punk shows every chance he got. Art was something he was always into. He did flyers and illustrations for his friends' bands and collaborated with other artists on some of these projects. Jason also had a love of nature and camping and drew inspiration from these activities.

CAG: How long have you been performing your craft?

**JP:** I have been displaying my work professionally since about 1995.

# CAG: What made you choose this medium or area of interest?

JP: I love the physical involvement that comes with traditional mediums like paint or pencil or ink, and I feel like the importance (or obsolescence) of being able to create images using that kind of vehicle comes to a head and has a kind of resonance (or, at least a sense of poignancy) during our time where technology can make them seem less efficient.

## CAG: Was there a person that encouraged or inspired you?

**JP:** My wife, Sharie, is also an artist and photographer and she's always pushing me and motivating me in my artwork.

# CAG: Do you have any professional schooling/ education?

**JP:** Not formally, but, I definitely have learned a lot from others I have met or heard from or seen or read and so forth.

## CAG: How long have you been a member of the Calvert Artists' Guild?

**JP:** Not for very long, maybe a few months.

### CAG: What prompted your decision to join the Artists' Guild?

**JP:** I met Gerry Wood and before long we were talking about art and she asked me if I'd ever thought about joining.

## CAG: What was the best thing you have done for your art career?

**JP:** Getting out of the studio and not focusing too narrowly on myself has helped me to be more observant of the world I'm working with. Being generous and willing to help out, sometimes even for free, often got me in situations that later helped me out.

## CAG: If you could change something about your art career, what would it be?

**JP:**I would have started it much earlier. I always loved making art, but I always have had the problem of keeping it to myself.

# CAG: Where do you get your inspiration or ideas for new works during "dry spells"?

JP: I stick to a good schedule. I have to be aware of my limitations. I cannot simply will myself to be inspired, and I cannot simply wait passively for inspiration to strike me. But having a good work schedule helps me to stay active even if I might otherwise feel down or unmotivated, and being active helps my mind recharge and keeps my imagination flowing. Having a regular pace where I map out time for daily artwork as well as some quiet time to read or study and meditate and getting adequate sleep and exercise is important to give my mind and body the opportunity to be receptive to new ideas while staying engaged in working them out.
