MAY SHOW JUDGE Carrie Patterson

Like a bee drawn to a flower, Carrie has always been interested in new ways of teaching art. Just after earning her BFA from James Madison University, she migrated to Asheville, NC to be near the site of Black Mountain College. She then flew off to paint at the Vermont Studio Center and the New York Studio School before making a bee-line to the University of Pennsylvania where she received an MFA in

painting. Everything she learned about the power of art and teaching she learned from artists who were also excellent teachers. She started teaching at The College of William and Mary where she spent four busy years, and finally landed at St. Mary's College of Maryland, where as a Professor she teaches drawing, painting, color, and Art for Educators and Community Activists. Since 2008 she has supervised a swarm of graduate students studying to be art teachers.

Carrie Patterson is an artist, art educator and one busy bee. She is the founder of Yellow Door Art Studios and lives in Leonardtown, Maryland with her husband Doug, and her two children. 
I started this three years ago February when I was in the midst of painting costumed models. This beautiful model had this gorgeous period style dress and was kind enough to pose for me. To fit the era of the dress, I planned to paint it in the Tudor style, painting every gold thread, loading her with jewels, building transparent colors for the flesh.

I started with a grisaille (monochromatic raw umber undercoat), and spent a lot of time on the dress pattern. I under painted the face transparent viridian, as the start of a glazing technique. Then I went over the whole dress with different reds. The work on the dress took a loooong time. Facing the thought of building up the pattern, then trying to paint individual gold threads burnt me out. I also noticed some small craters in the wood, so I was discouraged and stopped.

Life happened (illness, moving) and I went through a two year period where I only did a couple of paintings and drawings. I was starting to feel better this fall and was starting to paint more when I ran into my model. She didn't ask, but I know she was wondering where the painting was.

I decided to finish it. Second decision, no individual threads. Third, I had no patience for glazing, (a technique I've only done once when I copied Girl with a Pearl Earring). Fourth, I would cut back on the Jewelry and have the jewelry

near or on her skin muted, so that the eye would go to the face. During Tudor times, paintings were all about the clothes and jewels to show off their wealth. It is the reason I made the pattern of gold. This painting is all about the dress, but also about a beautiful woman, and I didn't want distractions near her face.

Staring in November, I worked more red over the dress, especially in the shadows that had been too dark. Next, I worked on the background, walls, floors, period landscape, and tapestry, with thin washes. Any drips would be on the unfinished dress and face.

I went back to the face and hair, then tackled the dress in stages. I created three different golds for three different values and hues. I made enough and froze what I didn't use so I would not have to try to remix and match. When the dress was finished, I finished the face and hair, and started adding the pearls to her hair and neck.

I used to track how many hours it took for me to paint something, but stopped a few years ago. I do remember though that it took 6 hours to paint just the pearls-not the connections nor silver and gold bits-just the pearls hanging down the inner skirt (see image taken that day). I remember because I was getting really sick of pearls at that point.

I finished the painting last week and framed it in time for the March show at North End Gallery in Leonardtown. As I look at it now, there are some bits I would like to alter, but nothing really important. If it doesn't sell, I will be taking it out of the frame, reevaluating those bits, and then in 6 months, I'll varnish it. I usually do not varnish my work, because it takes so long before the paint is fully cured, but I think the varnish will really bring out those subtleties of golds and reds in the dress.
